# Reading Requirements:

The students are given a book and asked to read the book over the summer and complete a book review and one activity. In the book review the students will give the title and author of the book, the genre, names of major characters, and brief description of book. The student has also been asked to give a recommendation of the book..



## Activities for PreK-2:

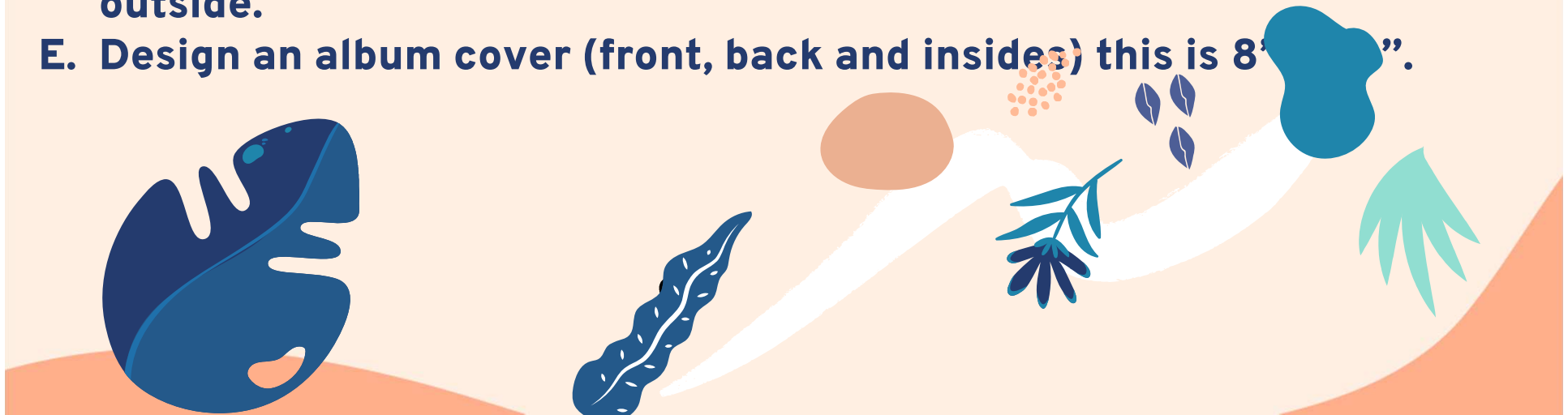
The students are asked to complete one activity from the list:

- A. Create a comic strip or story map from the events in the book.
- B. Create a book jacket for the book.
- C. Create a bookmark showing a scene from the book.
- D. Create story cards that tell about the book.
- E. Use a paper plate and create a character wheel of the characters in the book.

## Activities for Grades 3-5

The students are asked to complete one activity.

- A. Create a comic strip or story board for the events of the story.
- B. Design a website or construct a powerpoint/google slide presentation about the book.
- C. Make a scrapbook about the story or pretend a character has made it about his/her life.
- D. Create a book jacket complete with description of book on the outside.
- E. Design an album cover (front, back and insides) this is 8'".
